The Central and Old Kitchen Building is a two-part building attached to the north facade of the Administration Building. The south part of the building is two stories high, six bays long and four bays deep. The north portion is two and one half stories high, and eleven bays wide with a three bay wide gable-roofed pavillion extending from the north and south facades. The Central and Old Kitchen Building was constructed in 1912 to the designs of the architectural firm of Ellicott and Emmart.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Central and Old Kitchen Building is a two-part building attached to the north facade of the Administration Building. Although it was constructed eight years later than the Administration Building, both buildings are of the same general appearance. The color and size of the stonework are identical.

The south part of the building is two stories high, six bays long and four bays wide and is constructed of light grey-colored stone laid in regular courses with rough-cut stone used for the expressed belt course, water table and lintels. There is a steeply pitched hipped roof with two center chimneys and a hipped roof dormer on each facade. The windows have 9/9 sash.

The north portion is two and one half stories high, and eleven bays wide with a three bay wide gable-roofed pavillion extending from the north and south facades. There are hipped-roof double-sash dormers and a central cupola. Enclosed hipped-roof vestibules mark the north, south, and east entrances. The entrance on the north facade is framed by a classical entablature with engaged Doric Columns and pilasters.

The building's interior has been greatly changed since its construction as a kitchen and laundry in 1912. Both buildings are primarily used as offices, with a staff canteen on the basement floor.

The Central and Old Kitchen Building was constructed in 1912 to the design of Ellicott and Emmart, the firm which replaced Jackson C. Gott as the architect at Rosewood. It was originally intended to house one hundred "high grade" girls as well as serve as the central dining and kitchen hall at Rosewood. Later, laundry facilities were added to replace the frame laundry which stood north of Gundry Cottage. In 1938 a new kitchen and dining hall was built north of the Central Building.


