Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Keating Cottage, constructed in 1931, is a two and one half story stone building constructed on an L plan. The cottage is three bays deep and five bays long on the south facade, seven bays long on the north facade. The light colored stone is square cut and laid in regular courses, and there are a stone string course, water table and slab lintels over the windows. The slate, hipped roof has a modillioned and dentilled cornice with wide eaves.

The windows have 12/12 sashes and the 6/6 dormer windows have either hipped or dormer roofs. The main entrance is on the south facade, at the top of a flight of stone steps and is enclosed by a simple pedimented portico with Doric piers and pilasters and a wooden balustrade.

At the center of the hipped roof is an octagonal cupola with louvered sides separated by paired Doric pilasters.

A two story three bay long sun porch is to the right of the entrance. The bays are marked by Doric piers.



The Keating Cottage was completed in 1931. Along with Holland Cottage, they terminated the line of buildings formed by the southward - facing Lane, Urner and Administration buildings.

The Cottage was named for Dr. Frank Keating, longtime Superintendent of Medicine at Rosewood. Dr. Keating was selected as Superintendent on September 14, 1896 and died February 18, 1934.


