The Stump Cottage, built in 1900, is a two and one half story stone building located to the north east of the Administration Building at Rosewood. The building measures nine bays wide and four bays deep. The stone, which is similar in color and texture to that used at Urner Hall, is square cut and regularly laid and there are a string course, water table and slab lintels over the windows.

The building is oriented to the west and has an altered double doorway set in the center of the west facade. Across this facade is a one story, hipped roof porch supported by square brick piers. There is a projecting pediment on the center bay of the roof which is ornamented by jigsawn woodwork. There is a similar porch on the east facade supported by plain metal columns.

Windows generally have 9/9 sash. The center window arrangement on the second story of the west facade consists of narrow 6/6 windows flanking a 9/9 window and separated by Ionic columns with plain shafts. On the east facade are two six-paned round windows flanking a center 9/9 sash window.

There is a two story enclosed sun porch on the south east corner which measures three bays by two bays. Plain Doric pilasters separate the double 9/9 windows of the porch.

The Stump Cottage was completed in 1901 and was the third stone building constructed at Rosewood. It was the first commission executed by Jackson C. Gott, who succeeded J. Crawford Neilson as architect at Rosewood.


In 1900, a contract was awarded by Gott to the builder John Cowan for the construction of the Stump Cottage. Built to house seventy-five "high grade" male patients, it was completed in late 1901 at a cost of \$20,383. Additional funds were appropriated later that year by the legislature to furnish the building.

The building was named for General Herman Stump, one of the original members of the Board of Visitors. (See Record of the Board of Visitors, August 7, 1901, page 341). One of the dormitories was named after Margaret Bennett, who donated \$1000 for its furnishing.


