The Benzinger Building is a two-and-one-half-story stone structure with a steep pitched hipped roof, and two-story metal sunporches on the east and west facades. Designed by Henry Powell Hopkins, it was built in 1935 to house male patients with aggressive and destructive behavioral problems.

The Benzinger Building, constructed in 1935, is a stone two-and-one-half story structure with a steeply pitched hipped roof. The multi-colored stone is rough-cut and laid in irregular courses, with grey smooth-cut stone used for the water table and string <sup>course</sup> and dark brown and grey stone used for the jack arches above the windows. The building is oriented to the west and is nine bays wide and three bays deep.

The windows have 20/20 sash on the first story, 15/20 on the second story and are barred from the inside. The hipped roof dormers have paired 12/12 windows. Atop the slate covered roof is an octagonal cupola with pyramidal roof, ball finial, and ~~lowered~~ sides separated by paired Doric pilasters.

There is a two story sunporch on the east and west facades with four two-story stone Doric piers. The stone entablature is plain, save for rosettes above the piers, and there is a modillioned cornice. A wooden Chinese-Chippendale style railing runs along the top <sup>of the</sup> two flat-roofed porches. The porches are screened with a grid of heavy metal bars. Framing the entrance on the west facade is an elaborate and unusual metal Georgian style doorway composed of fluted Doric pilasters topped by a plain entablature and dentilled pediment. There is no access from the outside to the east porch.

The entrance on the south side is framed by a Georgian composition in smooth cut stone and is flanked by pilasters of pyramidal faced stone with caps and topped by a large modillioned swans-neck pediment in the center of which is an engaged fluted urn with ball finial.

Benziner Cottage for Boys was built in 1935 and was the second cottage specifically designed for patients with aggressive and destructive behavioral problems. It is also significant as the first large-scale commission at Rosewood by the Baltimore architect Henry Powell Hopkins.

Hopkins executed several important commissions for the State in the 1930s and 1940s including buildings at Springfield State Hospital, the University of Maryland and was responsible for the remodeling and restoration of the Old Treasury Building and State Office Buildings in Annapolis.


A well-known architect practicing in the Georgian Revival Style, Hopkins usually produced designs for buildings in brick, but probably decided that Benzinger Cottage should be of stone construction to harmonize with the earlier buildings. While still institutional in character, the Benziner Cottage possesses an architectural sophistication not seen in the earlier stone buildings at Rosewood. Smooth faced stone is used for the dentilled cornice, pilasters and elaborate Georgian style entrance. The full-blown academic classicism of this building is not often seen in institutional buildings of this nature and the workmanship and design of many of the architectural embellishments is exceptional.

Benziner Cottage was named for Harry Benzinger, a member of the Board of Visitors at Rosewood.


