Holland Cottage was a two-and-one-half story,hipped-roofed stone building on a high basement constructed on an L plan. It was completed in 1929 and closely resembled the Keating Cottage in appearance and plan.

Holland Cottage, built in 1929, stood west of Lane Cottage and terminated the line of buildings which has Keating Cottage as its eastern end. The building was oriented south.

As depicted in old photographs Holland Cottage was a two-and-one half story hipped roof stone building on a high basement, and built on an L plan. In appearance and plan, it closely resembled Keating Cottage, completed in 1931. The cream-colored stone was laid in regular courses and stone was also used for the expressed string courses and lintels above the windows. A two story three bay wooden porch with Doric piers and balustrade was located between two wings on the south-west corner. Atop the hipped roof was an octagonal cupola with louvered sides separated by paired Doric pilasters, a pyramidal roof and ball finial. A modillioned wooden cornice ran below the wide eaves of the building.

There was a pedimented entrance portico supported on Doric columns on the south facade. Windows on the first and second floors had 12/12 sash. The paved hipped roof dormer windows had 6/6 sash windows.

The Holland Cottage was completed in 1929 and followed closely the scale, proportions and designs of the earlier buildings at Rosewood designed by J. Crawford Neilson, Jackson C. Gott and Emmart & Ellicott. It resembled the Keating Cottage and both were designed to continue the symmetrical balance of buildings on the south side of the stone complex at Rosewood.

A 1958 insurance report described the uses to which the Holland Cottage was put: The basement floor contained a play-room, dining room, serving kitchen, nurses' stations and showers; the first and second floors contained dormitories, visitors' rooms, nurses' stations, clothing rooms and toilets; the third floor contained ten sleeping rooms which served as employees' quarters.
