Hill Cottage was a two-and-one half story gable-roofed stone building which was located north of Pembroke Cottage at Rosewood. It was completed in 1927 and was designed by the architect, William Emmart, as a custodial-care building for boys.

This building was demolished c. 1980.

Hill Cottage, built in 1927 was two-and-one-half-story gable roofed stone building which was located north of Pembroke Cottage at Rosewood. The building was oriented west.

Old photographs show that the building was twelve bays long with three bay wide pavillions at the east and west ends. It was constructed of cream colored stone laid in regular courses with smooth-faced stone used for the keystone arches above the first and second story windows. There were octogonal cupolas with louvered sides and pyramidal roofs at the east and west ends of the building.

Hill Cottage was built as a custodial care dormitory for male patients. A 1958 insurance report states that the basement housed a dining room, serving kitchens and playroom, with patient dormitories on the first and second stories and staff quarters on the third story.



Hill Cottage, a large custodial care building for boys, was completed in 1927 to the designs of William J. Emmart. The firm of Ellicott and Emmart was chosen to replace Jackson Gott as the architects at Rosewood and were responsible for several well-known commissions in Baltimore, including St. David's Episcopal Church and the Colonial Trust Building. Emmart, who continued in practice after the retirement of his partner in 1917, served as President of the Baltimore Architects Club for several years. No longer standing, Hill Cottage closely resembled Wyse Cottage, designed by Ellicott and Emmart thirteen years earlier.

The building was named for Thomas Hill, a member of the Rosewood Board of Directors.


