Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*
The Quinlan School House has been converted to a single family dwelling. According to the blurb in the Baltimore County Inventory Book, the house was built in 1892 as a school building and became a house in 1906. It is a 2-1/2 story buliding on a raised, parged foundation. There is a two-story bow addition on the north façade and a one-story shed roof addition on the east. Shed roof dormers protrude from the front gable roof. The building is sheathed in vinyl siding and the windows have been replaced.



As a result of these alterations, the building has little material integrity. The conversion from educational to residential use appears to have obscured the original configuration of the bulding. As a result of its lack of integrity, the building is not eligible under Criteria A (education) or C (architecture). Although the Quinlan name is associated with the farm across the road, research did not develop information that associates the building with a person who would meet the requirements of Criterion B. No research was conducted under Criterion D for this resource.
