**HALL HOUSE** - c. 1890 - 5001 Cedar Avenue at Magnolia, Relay. Frame house in Queen Anne style with strong A-shaped facade; overhanging front cross-gable; also side cross-gables; brown shingle wall covering. Shown as the Hall house in 1898 Bromley atlas, (Plate 8). Owner: Ian Gordon.

**VANDERBEEK HOUSE** - c. 1890 - 5112 South Rolling Road, Relay. Located at northeast corner of Linden. Frame and clapboard house with square corner tower containing the principal entrance; also wrap-around front and side porch. Plain variation of Queen Anne style. Rear fire-escape stairs (reported in 1988).

**CATHOLIC CHURCH & CATHOLIC CENTER** - 1880 - 5025 Cedar Avenue at Arlington, Relay. One story board and batten rectangular Gothic Revival church building, 40 by 60 feet, with principal entrance on the long side; five bays deep. Gothic windows with stained glass. Originally built as the Arlington Presbyterian Church, designed by Dixon and Carson as reported in the Sun, April 9, 1880. Name for the "Arlington" estate of P.G. Mitchell shown in 1877 atlas. Basement added in 1980s. In use by a Catholic group at time of 1988 survey by Jerry Fine.

**TOWN HALL** - 1891 - 1710 Arlington Avenue, Relay. Frame, shingle-covered, gable-roofed building of 2½ stories, with exposed eave-rafters; dentil mouldings; sixteen windows on first floor, eighteen on second. Built 1891 by the Relay Volunteer Fire Company. Originally had double doors facing the street for the exit of the fire engines and horse teams. Pedimented gable with half-round window. The building was acquired by the Improvement Association in 1948. It was long used for amateur theatricals.

**RELAY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL** - 1921 - 1620 Rolling Road, Relay. Brick school of one story, common bond walls set on moulded brick water table; one story, 75 by 50 feet; hip-roofed; also a gable-roofed entrance pavilion; doric pilasters flanking the double entrance doors. Arched panel above the windows. Lot was acquired in 1918 by Board of Education. Closed in 1977 by Baltimore County Board of Education. Sold in 1985 to Relay Children's Center. Located on 2.3-acre lot.
