

OAK HILL - 1897 - 7211 Bellona Avenue, Ruxton. Large, Georgian Revival house in fieldstone with some Victorian elements. Built by architect unknown for William Kennedy Boone, heir to owner family's fortune of the Mount Vernon Mills. The name Oak Hill had been applied to the Jenkins-Kennedy mansion at York Road and North Avenue, a property that was subdivided for row houses in or about 1895. The Oak Hill House was the scene of the 1989 decorator show house. Its second owner, James Herbert Boone, had been a world-traveler and art collector; in his will he bequeathed the property to Johns Hopkins University. Family members in 1989 reported that the original contractor was James C. Rowland, who put up nearby houses for the Jenkins family and for John Stinson. The Oak Hill porches were removed by James Herbert Boone.
