Facing northwest on Charles Street, the Maples, constructed circa 1890, is located near Ruxton on the west and Towson on the east in the Ninth District of Baltimore County. Denoted on the 1915 Bromley Atlas, the Maples is associated with the James Clark estate. In 1915 it was acquired by George Gunther, Jr. and then sold to the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1937. It is now part of the large Catholic complex of Villa Assumpta.

The Maples is sited on a level grassy lot with foundation plantings, landscaping, and surrounded by mature trees and shrubs. This high style Mission Revival dwelling stands two-and-a-half stories in height and measures seven bays wide. Constructed circa 1890, this stucco clad wood frame dwelling rests on a solid stucco covered foundation. Across the full-width of the façade is a one-story arcaded hipped roof porch. Projecting from the center of the porch is an arcaded hipped roof porte cochere. The windows on both the first and second stories are 4/1 and 6/1 double-hung wood sash. The center entry on the façade is accessed through a small vestibule under the porch. The entrance contains a double-leaf wood panel-and-light door. This main entry is illuminated with 2-light sidelights. A secondary entrance on the façade contains a single-leaf wood panel-and-light door and features a 1-light transom. Two hipped dormers on the facade are clad with wood shingles. This large dwelling is capped with a hipped roof covered with Spanish terra cotta tiles. Features of the roof include wide eaves with modillion. Rising above the roof are two exterior-end shouldered chimneys with corbeled caps and are clad in stucco. Other features include the typical Mission Revival parapet in the center with an iron balcony and two round-arched windows.

Other features include the typical Mission Revival parapet in the center with an iron balcony and two round-arched windows. Atop the parapet is a copper cross. The center window bay on the second story features an elaborately carved surround of a broken pediment and swag details. This dwelling is associated with the large Catholic complex of Villa Assumpta.

Facing northwest on Charles Street, the Maples, constructed circa 1890, is located near Ruxton on the west and Towson on the east in the Ninth District of Baltimore County. Ruxton is located near the western edge of the Ninth District, approximately two-and-a-half miles west of Towson. The Ninth District is the smallest in size to the rest of the districts with only 38.9 square miles, however, it contains the largest population. The Ninth District includes the upper suburbs of Baltimore City, and is bordered by the Third, Eighth, Eleventh and Twelfth Districts. In 1870, the district had a population of 10,731 and a decade following it doubled in size with a total of 21,414 people.(1)

According to one Baltimore County history, a gentleman named Thomas Hooker first settled Ruxton in 1699. On a 500-acre tract of land, which was yielded to him five years earlier, he built a house known as Carr's Pleasure. Today, this house can be seen on the eastern side of Bellona Avenue near the center of the town.(2) Denoted on the 1915 Bromley Atlas, the Maples is associated with the James Clark estate.(3) In 1915 it was acquired by George Gunther, Jr. and then sold to the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1937. It is now part of the large Catholic complex of Villa Assumpta.




