SCRUGGS HOUSE - After 1867 - 5125 South Rolling Road, Relay. Located at the southeast corner of New Rolling Road (Md. 166) and South Rolling Road, the original route to the landing. The J. P. Richardson house of the 1877 atlas, the L. Haines house in 1898 atlas, Mansard roofed and sided with brown wood shingles. Large square cupola. A plaque on the street facade gives date of 1857. However, no house is shown in the 1867 plat of "St. Dennis Extended." This tract was called "Braehead" in Volume II of the Hopkins 1877 atlas. Old deeds call the front street "Rolling Mill Road." One double frame house with a back building, located on Lots 121 and 122 was advertised in the Md. Journal, March 20, 1897. Owner: Robert L. Scruggs and wife.

WRIGHT HOUSE - Before 1898 - 5000 Tulip Avenue, Relay. Large, square, Queen Anne house with pedimented gables and iron cresting at the top of hipped roof. First shown in Bromley's 1898 atlas, Plate 8, the owner not identified. It was S. C. Tanner's in the 1915 edition, Plate 3. Owner: Christopher Wright (1984 list).

COMBS HOUSE - Before 1898 - 1729 Arlington Avenue, Relay. Frame, Queen Anne house with an octagonal tower on the left, an attic dormer on the right of the main facade. Full width front porch. The Magee house on Lot 8 of "Harmon" subdivision. James H. Magee paid \$300 for the lot in 18___. Shown in the 1898 Bromley atlas, Plate 8. Owner: Robert L. Combs.

TERWILLIGER HOUSE - Before 1867 - 1532 Rolling Road, Relay. A white, frame, clapboarded Gothic Revival house shown in 1877 atlas as Charles Richter's. Richter was possibly a tenant or a ground-renter; he also appears in the 1898 Bromley atlas. The 1915 atlas showed "Mrs. Risley" (Plate 5). The house stands on the landgrant called "The Forest" and the lot had been conveyed by Samuel France (whose name is distorted into Francis Avenue) to Catherine Colbert in 1866. The Md. Journal of July 29, 1871, mentioned S. A. Colbert's "several new and convenient cottages situated in a beautiful grove, commanding a fine view." The house belonged to various Johnstons and since 1944 has been in the Terwilliger family.

GREGG HOUSE - Before 1877 - 1554 Rolling Road, Relay. North of Francis Avenue between the former schoolhouse and "Linton." Cross-gabled Victorian Gothic Revival house. Shown as William Gregg's in the 1877 Hopkins atlas (Vol. II). Still shown as Gregg's in the 1898 Bromley atlas but as the Diggs house in Bromley's 1915 edition.
