


Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

This property is a 2½-story wood frame Gothic Revival house constructed on a masonry wall foundation. The house measures three bays by three bays and has an irregular plan. There is an attached garage on the west side and rear gable-and shed-roof additions. There is a central cross-gable in the principal façade and lancet windows in the gables. There are metal double-hung sash (1/1 lights) windows, the roof is clad by composition shingles and the house is clad by vinyl siding.

This house was built in 1888, according to the owner (Mrs. Ethel Troyer) and Baltimore County Tax records. Replacement windows, the attached garage, and the addition of vinyl siding have reduced this building's architectural integrity. This property appears to be not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.
