


This building is a 1½-story wood frame bungalow constructed on a concrete wall foundation. The house measures six bays by two bays and has a gable-front porch with squared posts on rock-faced concrete block piers. Typical bungalow elements include triangular knee braces, exposed rafter ends, and 4/1 wood double-hung sash windows. The roof is clad by composition shingles and the building is clad by wood shingles.

This house was built between ca. 1910 and 1930. A common early twentieth century house type, there are no significant distinguishing features in this building and its original fabric has been changed by additions and alterations. This property appears to be not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.




