



**Description of Property and Eligibility Determination:** *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

Talbott House is a ca. 1920 cross-gable, 2-story dwelling on a fieldstone foundation with a centrally placed 2-story rear ell, full-length front veranda, enclosed porches, and original double hung 2/2 light windows. The dwelling occupies high ground just below the brow of a hill and at the corner of Corbett (formerly Monkton) and York roads, affording extensive vistas to the west and, to a lesser extent, to the south. Asbestos siding, vinyl soffits and pediment infills, porch reconstruction and enclosure, and a heavily eroded yardscape diminish the historical significance of this building and its setting.

No historical events of note occurred on the Talbott House lot nor were any of its owners persons of particular historical importance (Criteria A and B). Indeed, the property changed hands six times in fourteen years (1915-1928), most or all of the owners residing locally, although whether or not they occupied the Talbott house has not been determined. Asbestos and vinyl siding, front and rear enclosed porches, and an eroded yardscape lacking original landscape detract from the ensemble of materials, design motifs, and overall character of this building that would otherwise have marked it as a good example of early 20th-century vernacular architecture in the Chesapeake Basin (Criterion C) and the lack of integrity and the unremarkable history of the house render it of very limited use in researching the history of the area. The Talbot House is ineligible for inclusion into the National Register of Historic Places.

Talbott House is a ca. 1920 cross-gable, 2-story dwelling on a fieldstone foundation with a centrally placed 2-story rear ell, full-length front veranda, enclosed porches, and original double hung 2/2 light windows. The dwelling occupies high ground just below the brow of a hill and at the corner of Corbett (formerly Monkton) and York roads, affording extensive vistas to the west and, to a lesser extent, to the south. Asbestos siding, vinyl soffits and pediment infills, porch reconstruction and enclosure, and a heavily graded yardscape diminish the historical significance of this building and its setting.

Talbott House was erected on a typical Chesapeake two-story cross gable plan with three bays, one room deep, a central entrance with paired, symmetrically placed 2/2 sash double hung windows on the first and second floors of the principal (south) façade. A third window on the second floor is placed directly over the front door and, above the window in the central gable, is a smaller window; sash type indeterminate. The gable is infilled with vinyl siding and the soffits are also vinyl clad. A veranda, largely reconstructed sometime since the Talbott family acquired the property in 1953, extends across the entire front of the building, but is enclosed at the east end (1964) and wraps around to the east obscuring the original first floor of the east façade. The Talbotts rebuilt the front porch, parged the foundation, applied vinyl to the soffits, end gables, and the central gable, and sided the entire building with asbestos shingles, presumably directly on top of the original German siding.

The Talbotts enclosed the rear porch on the west façade in the 1950s and since have sided it in vinyl. The west wall of the original part of the building has two windows, both with 2/2 sashes, one immediately above the other, and a small window of indeterminate sash type directly above them in the vinyl clad end gable. Fenestration on the east façade appears to be identical, although the enclosed wrap-around porch encases and obscures the entire first floor of that wall. The two-story ell, also asbestos sided, has two windows on the second floor, seemingly identical to those on the west and south facades of the original building. The owner, Wayne Talbott, noted that the ell had been built before his parents purchased the property in 1953. The north façade was not accessible.

The asphalt shingle roof is relatively new. Paired brick chimneys with simple corbelled finishes frame the central gable and a third stove or furnace interior brick chimney, centrally placed and simply finished, straddles the ridgeline at the end of the rear ell. The rear chimney has been repointed recently and the cap rebuilt with two or three courses of brick in a non-descript bond.

The original parcel has been subdivided for a late 20th-century residential neighborhood. The yards on the south side of the building is very narrow, descending steeply to Corbett Road and enhancing the verticality of the building. The west yard, currently used for some sort of commercial work and storage, is graded and no vestige of earlier landscaping was apparent. A frame storage building with plywood cladding and a pitched roof occupies the west yard.

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Owner Wayne Talbott described some of the interior framing as 'log construction,' suggesting that the building was not a kit. His description of the original siding as "Dutch lap" supports an early 20th-century date for the building.

No historical events of note occurred on the Talbott House lot nor were any of its owners persons of particular historical importance (Criteria A and B). Indeed, the property changed hands six times in fourteen years (1915–1928), most or all of the owners residing locally, although whether or not they occupied the Talbott house has not been determined. Asbestos and vinyl siding, front and rear enclosed porches, and a graded yard lacking original landscape detract from the ensemble of materials, design motifs, and overall character of this building that would otherwise have marked it as a good example of early 20th-century vernacular architecture in the Chesapeake Basin (Criterion C) and the lack of integrity and the unremarkable history of the house (Criterion D) preclude its eligibility for inclusion into the National Register of Historic Places.

The Talbott House was built in a vernacular style—probably by local builders—with roots in the Picturesque Gothic Revival architecture of the mid-19th century. It has remained in the Talbott family since Wayne Talbott’s parents purchased the house and land in 1953, and the family is responsible for many, if not all of, the major alterations to the house and grounds. The Cole family owned the building between 1928 and 1953, but the original owners cannot be identified with confidence. The two-acre parcel has been associated with a nearby farm, part of Hereford Resurveyed, at least since the second decade of the 20th century, and surrounding farmland, particularly on Corbett Road has been subdivided for housing.

Asbestos and vinyl siding, front and rear enclosed porches, and an graded yardscape lacking original landscape detract from the ensemble of materials, design motifs, and overall character of this building that would otherwise have marked it as a good example of early 20th-century vernacular architecture in the Chesapeake Basin (Criterion C) and the lack of integrity and the unremarkable history (Criteria A, B, and D) of the house render it of very limited use in researching the history of the area. The Talbot House is ineligible for inclusion into the National Register of Historic Places.






Figure 3. Talbott House tax map.
