Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The Sea Pride Crab House 2 is a purpose-built commercial structure. Although its current appearance would suggest that it is a late twentieth century structure, the side elevations indicate that it was constructed in the 1930s. The building is five bays wide and is built of brick. The lateral walls extend above the roofline to form a parapet characteristic of commercial buildings in the 1920s and 1930s. The shed addition on the front has been renovated with contemporary brick and aluminum siding. The Sea Pride Crab House is one of the few commercial buildings remaining from the 1920s in this portion of Liberty Road. Most of the structures shown on early USGS quads have been replaced with more contemporary commercial structures or were former single family dwellings converted to commercial use.

The building does not display any significant characteristics which would qualify it for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. Therefore, it is not eligible under Criteria A, B, or C. No research was done to determine eligibility under Criterion D.


