The two story frame house located at 34 Winters Lane contributes to the district, which is comprised largely of similar modest frame houses of various vernacular forms dating from the last quarter of the nineteenth century and the beginning of the twentieth. This house appears to date from the latter part of the 19th century. The Winters Lane section of the West Catonsville neighborhood is additionally important for local significance as the black community first settled in the late 1860's by freed blacks and continuously associated with this community's development.


