
This house is the twin to 209 W. Seminary but unfortunately it has lost much of its original interest under asbestos shingle siding. It does, though, retain many of the details mentioned with regard to No. 209; except it is noted that the porch columns appear to have been renewed. 207 differs in detail as well with the addition of a slight flared overhang of the second floor at the level of the porch eaves and is carried continuously around the octagonal turret and the side elevation. The flare of the modern shingles suggests that the house may have always been shingled.

Two over two sash fill the window openings and there are particularly fine corbeled chimney caps on the chimneys rising behind the barge of the eaves of each end gable of the front slope of the roof.

There is a two story, gabled barn at the rear of the lot with board and batten siding.
