The West Catonsville Historic District represents residential and commercial architecture significant as a typical, intact example of the Baltimore area's development of both stylistic and vernacular buildings over the period of the latter half of the 19th century through the early 20th century. The Winter's Lane section of the West Catonsville neighborhood is additionally important for local significance as the black community first settled in the late 1860s by freed blacks and continuously associated with this community's development. The house at 182 Winters Lane is a common early 20th century vernacular house form derived from the bungalow and contributes to the district in terms of location, design, setting, and materials.



