

This house represents another example, though somewhat more sophisticated, of the typical Lutherville cottage design. Like other houses it has a front, central attic gable perpendicular to the main gabled roof ridge dominating the three bay facade.

Of particular note are the two front gabled dormers, flanking the central gable, with their decorative flared trim and semi-circular arched windows reflecting the arched windows of the gables.

At the side elevation there is an interesting hood supported on large, diagonal braced, chamfer edged brackets over the side entrance. Four over Four sash with paneled shutters at the first floor windows and louvered blinds at the second floor windows is the typical fenestration. The side door with four heavily moulded panels has a two light transom similar to the sidelights and transom of the central entrance door which opens onto the front, one story porch with square columns and jigsaw out corner brackets supporting the half-hipped porch roof. A shingled balustrade, surely a modern replacement, is set between the columns and conflicts in texture with the German siding of the house.




6. LOCATION MAP (Plan Optional)
