This dwelling at 1014 Windsor Road is located in Sudbrook Park in Pikesville in the Third District of Baltimore County. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1973, Sudbrook Park Historic District is significant as a small community designed and planned by Frederick Law Olmstead. It was planned as a summer resort for wealthy Baltimore residents at the turn of the 20th century. Known for his emphasis on nature, Olmstead designed Sudbrook Park with importance on curvilinear streets, large lots, and an abundance of mature trees and vegetation. The houses in Sudbrook Park were designed with several deed restrictions. The structure was required to be sited forty feet back from the street and ten feet from neighboring property lines. The height of each property was to be three stories and the styles allowed were rural and not urban.

This Queen Anne-style dwelling, constructed circa 1911, is sited near Windsor Road on a level grassy lot among mature trees, shrubs, and foundation plantings. The two-and-a-half story, four-bay house has a solid coursed random rubble foundation and a wood-frame structural system clad with wood shingles. The off-center entry features a wood door with panels and eight lights. There are three double-hung wood sash windows with 6/1 lights. The one-story, three-bay front porch has wood Tuscan pilasters supporting a half-hipped roof which has subsequently been extended to form a carport alongside the dwelling. The second story has two wood frame, double-hung sash windows with 6/1 lights. All the openings are set in square-edge wood surrounds and the windows have wood lug sills. The house has a wide wood cornice and a hipped roof with overhanging eaves and a wood soffit. There is one hipped dormer, clad in wood shingles and containing two 4-light wood casement windows. One interior brick chimney with a corbeled cap rises through the roof. A one-story wood frame addition with a poured concrete foundation has been built onto the side of the dwelling.

This Queen Anne-style dwelling, constructed between 1911 and 1915, is sited near Windsor Road on a level grassy lot among mature trees, shrubs, and foundation plantings. The two-and-a-half story, four-bay house has a solid coursed random rubble foundation and a wood-frame structural system clad with wood shingles. The off-center entry features a wood door with panels and eight lights. There are three double-hung wood sash windows with 6/1 lights. The one-story, three-bay front porch has wood Tuscan pilasters supporting a half-hipped roof which has subsequently been extended to form a carport alongside the dwelling. The second story has two wood frame, double-hung sash windows with 6/1 lights. All the openings are set in square-edge wood surrounds and the windows have wood lug sills. The house has a wide wood cornice and a hipped roof with overhanging eaves and a wood soffit. There is one hipped dormer, clad in wood shingles and containing two 4-light wood casement windows. Constructed between 1911 and 1915, this dwelling at 1014 Windsor Road is located in Sudbrook Park in Pikesville in the Third District of Baltimore County. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1973, Sudbrook Park Historic District is significant as a small community designed and planned by Frederick Law Olmstead. It was planned as a summer resort for wealthy Baltimore residents at the turn of the 20th century. In 1890, the Sudbrook Company purchased a 204 acre tract just south of Reisterstown Road in Pikesville. During the hiatus of his career, Olmstead was commissioned to design Sudbrook Park. One acre of land was set aside by the company for a depot for the Western Maryland Railway.

Known for his emphasis on nature, Olmstead designed Sudbrook Park with importance on curvilinear streets, large lots, and an abundance of mature trees and vegetation. The houses in Sudbrook Park were designed with several deed restrictions. The structure was required to be sited forty feet back from the street and ten feet from neighboring property lines. The height of each property was to be three stories and the styles allowed were rural and not urban.(1)



 Existing street street plan  1973 Historic district boundary 


