
4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **NO**

This shingled house represents another version of the typical Lutherville house with the front three bay facade having a central attic gable set at a right angle to the main low roof ridge. A semi-circular arched window fills the front attic gable while a flat headed attic window is set above the two bays of the south facade of the main house. A two story, two bay gabled wing extends to the rear from the south east corner of the main structure. The north end facade has a two story, three sided bay window with moulded eaves similar to the unornamented verges and eaves of the main roof.

The windows typically have six over six sash except those of the first floor, front facade which are elongated to the front porch floor and flank the sidelighted and transomed front door and have six over nine sash. The one story porch has a pediment set above the entrance and spans across the front of the house supported on square Tuscan columns and pilasters set with a plain balustrade of square balusters.

The house appears to be a rather early example of its form in Lutherville.
