
This shingled house is another version of the typical Lutherville cottage built in a 'T' shaped plan. The windows typically have one over one sash and are hung with louvered blinds.

A chimney at the gabled end nearest the driveway and the rear two story wing with its modern garage doors and its two over two sash appear to be strangely out of context with the original house form.

Of particualr note is the handling of the one story front porch which fills the angle between the vings and extends around the facade of the gabled wing facing the street. The porch, now enclosed with screening, is carried on large, plain, square columns set with a decorative jig-saw cut slat balustrade.
