
4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **NO**

In general character this house is similar to its neighbor, 212 Melanchthon. Number 206 has three bays, a central attic gable feature, an arched attic gable window, and a one story front porch. Its front door with sidelights and transom, though, is at the east end of the main facade of the first floor, balancing two elongated windows. Compensating for the narrowness of the house, a two story wind with several additions extends to the east.

Four over four sash fill the second floor window openings while six over four sash fill the first floor elongated windows. Louvered blinds are hung at the windows.

The front facade has a one story perch supported on thin, square columns set with modern wrought-iron railings.
