
4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION

OPEN TO PUBLIC

This long shingled house presents unusual asymmetrical facades with interestingly positioned attic dormers and gables. The front entrance facade which faces Morris Avenue and is characterized by an off center attic dormer, has decorative shingles flaring at the roof eave. There is one bay directly under it at the second floor and doubled windows below at the first floor level. The windows typically have two over two sash and are hung with louvered blinds. Wide frames of double, squarish windows and flat strapwork in the side attic gables imitate half timbering.

The entrance has a simple doorway behind an open, bracketed pediment on the veranda. This porch which wraps around into the east, Franke Avenue facade has thin, square columns set with a plain balustrade. The porch stops at an overhanging, gabled second floor section with decorative shingling.
