
4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **no**

This shingled house is a typical Lutherville cottage form with a front central attic gable set perpendicular to the main roof ridge. A triangular headed, four light window is set in the front gable and above the second floor, three sided bay window. The bay window, which projects onto the one story front porch roof, and the transomed front door are flanked by two windows on each side creating an atypical five-bay facade.

The porch or veranda extends at each end beyond the front facade, connecting at the west with a rear wing. Paired, square columns, supporting the roof, are set on a solid balustrade.

Complete with louvered blinds, including the bay window, the windows typically have two over two sash which are elongated to four over two sash at the windows opening onto the veranda.
