
4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC

This wood shingled house, like its neighbors on Morris Avenue, is a late version of its style as adapted to a somewhat smaller scaled structure and employing more academic proportions. The steeply pitched gable roof has plain, unornamented cornices set directly over three window bays of the second floor each with six over one sash and hung with louvered blinds. The attic is lighted with quarter fan lights set into the end gables.

At the first floor, front facade, the paneled entry door with its transom is flanked with triple, grouped windows. Each of these window units consists of a large central section and narrow side sections, all set with one over six sash. Grouped windows, in pairs, are seen at the two bay, gabled end facades.

The doorway is fronted by a porch hood with an elliptical arch cut into the typanum of its open pediment supported on pairs of square columns. The north facade has a one story porch with square columns set on a solid balustrade.
