



This is a particularly fine example of this 20th century style. The low gabled roof with its slight pitch change extends typically over the front porch and is supported on square columns set on pedestal height stone piers. The balustrade is shingled like the house. Breaking total symmetry of the front facade, the porch extends an extra bay to the east under a low hipped extension of the roof. Also, a tall, stone chimney protrudes from the front slope of the roof behind the east gable's verge.

More usual, though, a shed roofed dormer centers on the roof. It has three, square, nine light windows. Below, the front door, behind the front steps with their stone cheek walls, is flanked with paired windows with double hung sash.
