DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

GREENLEA, dating from the 1880s, is a two and one-half story frame house. Originally it had a gable roof, with a large gable centered in its principal, south front, placing it in the Gothic Revival style. In a style adopted after the American Centennial, the roof was replaced with the existing gambrel roof having large gabled dormers, an adaptation of certain New England colonial forms. The plan is essentially unchanged and many original interior details remain but some are replaced in the Colonial Revival style, primarily in the first story.

Immediately off the northwest corner of the dwelling is the Doctor's Office, a small frame structure contemporary with the dwelling and similarly detailed containing a waiting and consultation or examination room.

Immediately north of the dwelling is an elevated water tank, fully enclosed to grade with battered walls, its roof a steep, flared mansard. A wind pump formerly was on top.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

GREENLEA is a commodious but unpretentious dwelling of a rural physician who enjoyed a long practice in the community. His office is a valuable document of rural medical practice in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The ~~water~~ tower is the single example, in this Historic District, of the French Renaissance Revival style.

The house, built ca. 1886, stands on part of Chamberlain's Meadows Resurveyed. The land was the gift of Joshua R. Green to his son Dr. John S. Green upon his marriage to Eleanor Baldwin.


