- BA-463 **A.S. COOPER HOUSE** - Before 1877 - North side of Trenton Road, 0.2 mile east of Trenton Mill Road. Apparently the A.S. Cooper house shown in 1877 inset map of Trenton Village. Shown as Shellman M. Cooper's in 1918 tax ledger. Stone house, 3 bays wide, gable roof of aluminum, vernacular style. Full width front porch. One-story wing to northeast. Owner: Paul R. Shaffer.
- BA-464 **J.H. COLE HOUSE** - c. 1857 - 16552 Trenton Road, 0.3 mile east of Trenton Mill Road. Jabez H. Cole was shown as owner in 1877 atlas and he also had a smithy west of his residence. House passed to David M. Thompson in 1885 and has remained in that family. Stone, Victorian style double house, four bays wide, rectangular window in cross-gable, which is trimmed with shingles in imbricated pattern. Recently added back building in "Tudor Revival". Excellent condition. Owner: Donald H. Thompson.
- BA-465 **TRENTON EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHRISTIAN CHURCH** - 1859 - Southwest corner of Trenton Road and Trenton Church Road. White frame and clapboard church built in 1859 on a hill overlooking village on land donated by George E. and Maria Zouck. Shown in 1877 atlas. Congregation is offshoot of a Manchester body of 1760. Gable roof of tin, vernacular style, open belfry with pointed spire.
- BA-466 **DANIEL COLHOUN HOUSE** - 1850-1875 - (East side of) 16301 Trenton Church Road, southeast of Trenton Road. Log house under frame and stucco outer construction. Tin gable roof; vernacular style. Two stories, 5 bays; 1-story wing; 2 inside end-chimneys of stuccoed brick; full-width rear porch. Shown as W. Murphy's in 1877 atlas. At end of dead-end road. Owner: Daniel Colhoun, Jr.
- BA-467 **MOSES CULLISON HOUSE** - 1890 - Terminus of Trenton Church Road, 0.85 mile southeast of Trenton Road. Age proved by chimney datestone. Shown as Moses Cullison's on 1850 map and as John Kemp's in 1877 atlas. Essentially unaltered since it was built. Stone, 2-story, vernacular style, 5-bay house; central entrance hall; crimped tin gable roof painted red; stone foundation; full-width porch; 6-on-6 double hung sash windows. Also outbuildings (a) stone smokehouse, (b) stone spring house, and (c) barn on stone foundation. Owner: Eliot Ganse.

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
