Constructed circa 1830, the Clynmalira barns are located in the Tenth District between the historic villages of St. James Corners and Phoenix. Clynmalira shows up on the 1850 along with the name Henry Carroll. The barns do appear to date around the same period as the house and therefore it is assumed they are in place prior to 1850 when Carroll's residence shows on the early atlas. H.H. Carroll appears on the 1877 Atlas with Clynmalira farm. The 1877 shows Carroll as a patron of the atlas with 790 acres and that he maintains an occupation as a farmer. It also explains that Carroll was born in Baltimore County in 1830. The 1915 Atlas shows Mary Groves at this location with 295 acres, then called Woodbrook.

These two stone barns are sited back from the road behind the large dwelling of Clynmalira. A long gravel driveway leads to the barns which are sited on a sloping lot surrounded by cattle fields. Constructed circa 1830, these barns are one-and-a-half stories high and are of random rubble stone construction. The first barn has one interior-end brick rebuilt chimney, one doorway, and eleven 9x9 sliding vinyl windows. It is capped with an asphalt shingle roof. The second barn features two single-leaf flush wood doors, one with a three-light transom, one missing window, and one 6/6 double-hung wood sash window. It has an overhanging front eave and a wood cornice with a side gable roof sheathed with standing-seam metal. It has a gable roof addition on the side elevation, which is covered with asphalt shingles and features three open bays that is supported with metal posts.

Constructed circa 1830, the Clynmalira barns are located in the Tenth District between the historic villages of St. James Corners and Phoenix. . The Tenth District is highly agricultural with over 48 square miles within its boundaries. In 1881, it was noted to having a population of 2,374, which was down by 192 since the 1870 census.¹ The district is bounded by Harford County on the east, the Eleventh District on the south, Seventh and Eighth Districts on the west, and Seventh District on the north.

Clynmalira shows up on the 1850 along with the name Henry Carroll.² The barns do appear to date around the same period as the house and therefore it is assumed they are in place prior to 1850 when Carroll's residence shows on the early atlas. H.H. Carroll appears on the 1877 Atlas with Clynmalira farm.³ The 1877 shows Carroll as a patron of the atlas with 790 acres and that he maintains an occupation as a farmer. It also explains that Carroll was born in Baltimore County 1830. The 1915 Atlas shows Mary Groves at this location with 295 acres, which was then called Woodbrook.⁴


