Rectangular, two story, two bay, stuccoed, side gable, detached dwelling with a two story ell with interior end chimney hipped roof front and shed-roofed side entry porches and a projecting second story rear wing covered with asbestos siding.

The alterations described above, including the covering over of the original fabric and the addition of a modern porches and wings, have obscured much of the historic character of this mid-nineteenth century, vernacular dwelling.

Recorded as the J. Bevan House on G. M. Hopkins' 1877 Atlas of Baltimore County, this house was probably built in 1872 by Richard A. Keller, prior to its purchase by John C. Bevan in that year. This small, vernacular house is a good example of a common mid-nineteenth century house type. However, its integrity has been compromised and thus its significance undermined, as a result of incompatible, twentieth century alterations and additions.


