- BA - 757A **GORE HOUSE** - Before 1898 - Railroad Avenue. The second house on this lot is immediately south of Site No. BA 757, frame, with rubber roofing, shingles used as wall covering; Victorian in style; gable roofed; on stone foundation; poor condition. Owner: Blake T. Gore.
- BA - 758 **TIMOTHY FROCK HOUSE** - Before 1915 - 83 Railroad Avenue. Shown as T.S. Goodwin's in 1915 atlas. T-shaped vernacular style frame house; imbricated shingles in gables; wood shingles (painted blue) on walls. Gable roof. At time of 1972 survey, owner was Timothy D. Frock. Owner: James R. Baldwin.
- BA - 759 **FRITZ HOUSE** - Before 1915 - 313 Railroad Avenue. Shown in 1915 atlas as W. Turner's. Frame house in vernacular style, covered with green composition shingles; gable roof; brick foundation. Owner: George W. Fritz.
- BA - 760 **DR. CHARLES LEAS HOMESTEAD** - Before 1898 - Railroad Avenue. Shown in 1898 atlas as part of the estate of Dr. Charles Leas, founder of Glyndon. It was Joseph Omeara's [sic] in 1915 atlas. O'Meara was a stone-cutter, the grandfather of present owner. Large, rambling, sixteen-room frame house. Covered with white clapboard. Victorian in style, with tin gable roof; stone foundation. Also frame and clapboard Victorian stable with louvered cupola. Owner: James E. O'Meara.
- BA - 761 **SEILER HOUSE** - Before 1915 - Bond Avenue. Shown as Paul S. Levy's in 1915 atlas. Frame and clapboarded house in a plain Queen Anne style with gable roof, stone foundation. Owner: Richard W. Seiler.
- BA - 762 **FREESE HOUSE** - 1895 - South side of Bond Avenue, just east of tracks. Replacement of a house shown in 1877 atlas as George M. Gill's. Present house was built by Charles T. Cockey. Shown as R.C. Loock's in 1915 issue. Large, 2-½ story frame house in Victorian style various cross-gables in Downing-Vaux tradition, covered with shingles, with gable roof and stone foundation. Owner: Davis B. Freese.
- BA - 763 **HOOVER HOUSE** - Before 1915 - South of Bond Avenue via gravel road; east side of tracks. Shown in 1915 atlas as C.T. Cockey's. Frame and clapboarded house in
