Blunt Farm and Granite Quarries
(Mount Welcome)

This colonial-style frame house is 1 1/2 stories tall with a full-width front porch. Painted yellow, the house has a gable roof with dormers. The house is well back from the road and west of power lines.

The house was probably built by the ancestors of Captain Walters, who served in the War of 1812 and married Elizabeth Worthington. They lie in the family burial ground. The Blunt family still owned blueprints in 1984 for restoration work performed c. 1930 by Hugh I. Kavanagh, an architect from Baltimore.

The foundations of a quarry engine house survived in 1976. The quarry is documented by surviving photographs.

The property was owned in the 1960s by Fitzallen Blunt, who died in 1970. The current owners are Thomasina A. Blunt's heirs.
