Circa 1825-1840

This small stone farm house was probably the home of the tenant farmer on Johns' Black Rock Farm. Tax records indicate that the farm had a dwelling house on it at least as early as 1852, and architecturally it appears to be as early as the beginning of the second quarter of the nineteenth century. The bank barn is typical of all barns in the area, built into a hillside facing south.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Callahan House is a stone house, one and one-half storeys in height, one long bay in length; it measures approximately 16½ by 19 feet. This structure, which probably dates from the early 19th century, appears not to be a principal dwelling but rather a kitchen house or a tenant house. No larger early dwelling remains on this property.

The principal front is the south gable end, containing a window and a door in the first storey, two windows above; east and west sides contain a single window in the first storey only; and the north end contains two small windows in the upper storey only, flanking the chimney which rises as a brick stack flush with the north gable wall. All windows are void of sash but the remaining frames are of narrow beaded material. The sash were probably 6/6. Masonry above openings is supported by massive rough stone lintels.

Internally each storey consists of a single room; a large fireplace is in the north end of the first storey, its wooden lintel chamfered away from the flames on the inner side. An enclosed stair rises east of the chimney. Interior finishes are void of mouldings, the windows and doors being trimmed with plain material. The hewn second floor joists, and the underside of the flooring, are heavily coated with whitewash, all covered by later plaster on circular-sawn lathe. The rafters are mitred at the ridge.

A very large bank barn stands west of the house. The taller upper or loft story, with its gambrel roof cantilevers over the south grou storey wall to shelter entrances and windows to the stalls within.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Callahan House, located on Stringtown Road just east of Falls Road, is probably the surviving tenant house of the Johns' family's Black Rock Farm. The land was patented as Miller's Delight in 1798 by Richard Johns and inherited by John Tolley Johns about 1850.

The 1852 Baltimore County tax shows improvements on the land, although the 1823 tax does not. Testimony in an 1870 equity case indicates that there were tenants on the property and that both the land and buildings had been abused and were in poor condition. One house and a lime quarry may be seen in this location on the plat which was prepared for the trial.

Shadrack Kemp, who purchased the farm at public sale, owned other property nearby and probably had a tenant farmer living there. Not until about 1911, as indicated by taxes, were there other buildings surrounding this house. The 1918 tax assessment specifically lists this as "Tenant house #2" and gives dimensions which correspond to those of the present structure.

The property has been farmed continuously and was not divided until 1964 when fifty acres were sold to the Young Men's Christian Association for its Black Rock Camp.
