Description of Property and Justification: *(Please attach map and photo)*

This house is significant as a substantial mid-nineteenth century farmhouse with some later nineteenth century decoration. The site has been continuously associated with agriculture since its establishment.

This 2-1/2 story house, 5 bays wide by one room deep with an ell to the rear, faces east. Present siding appears to be aluminum, with the small center-facing gable clad in diamond-shaped shingles with saw-tooth edging. Standing seam metal covers the roof, and brick interior chimneys rise from both gable ends.

On the first floor of the principal (east) façade, the entrance is located in the central bay: a 10-panel door is set in a paneled surround with an 8-pane transom and 3-pane sidelights. Two 6/6 sash windows appear on either side of the entrance. On the 2nd floor, the central bay holds a tripartite window, consisting of a 6/6 window flanked by a tall, narrow 2/2 sash. 6/6 sash occupy the remaining bays. A pointed arch window in the center gable lights the attic.

This extensive and well-maintained farm complex includes a large frame barn, contemporary with the house, featuring louvered

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two and one half story house, five bays wide by one room deep with an ell to the rear, faces east. Present siding appears to be aluminum, with the small center facing gable clad in diamond-shaped shingles with sawtooth edging. Standing-seam metal covers the roof, and brick interior chimneys rise from both gable ends.

On the first floor of the principal (east) facade, the entrance is located in the central bay: a ten-panel door is set in a paneled surround with an eight-pane transom and three-pane sidelights. Two 6/6 sash windows appear on either side of the entrance. On the second floor, the central bay holds a tripartite window, consisting of a 6/6 window flanked by tall, narrow 2/2 sash. 6/6 sash occupy the remaining bays. A pointed-arch window in the center gable lights the attic.

This extensive and well-maintained farm complex includes a large frame barn, contemporary with the house, featuring louvered ventilators in its walls and in its gabled cupola. Other minor outbuildings in the farmyard contribute to the site's character.
