- BA- 918 **SHERWOOD CHURCH RECTORY** - 1842 - South side of Sherwood Road, south of church. Stone, 2-½ story house in vernacular style, three bays wide, gable roof, dormers, full width front porch. Built to house the rector of Sherwood Episcopal Church. Shown on 1850 map as "Parsonage". A dwelling would have been needed after 1835 when the first full-time vicar, the Rev. John Palmer Robinson, was assigned to Sherwood. Now used as an activities center. (See American, September 9, 1843.)
- BA- 919 **TOTNES (SITE)** - 1850-75 - East side of York Road, opposite Cockeysville Road. House that had belonged to Judge Joshua F. Cockey. Demolished after listing, February 1976. First shown in 1877 atlas, it had been a tall, High Victorian house, frame and clapboard, 2-½ stories, with cross-gable, gable roof, dormers, full-width front porch, internal chimneys. Owner (at that time): Ira C. Rigger. (Totnes is a village on the English Channel).
- BA- 920 **HAILE HOUSE (SITE)** - 1825-1850 - 11500 York Road, Marble Hill vicinity, west side of road. Age is uncertain, but may be shown as Mrs. Webster's on 1850 map and as J.W. Wight's in 1877 atlas. Acquired by Elmer R. Haile in 1919 from George W. Kurtz. Located SW of extinct Thornton Mill. House on a slope, back from road. Two-segment telescope house, vernacular style, two stories; main block is stucco over stone; smaller wing is frame and shingle. Gable roofing. This was the farmhouse of the Bonnie Blink property and in 1918 measured 19 x 29 and 19 x 28 in the two segments. No house of these dimensions is found in 1798. Fair condition, 1979. Owner: Margaret E. Haile, et al. In May of 1980 was demolished in connection with building Bonnie Blink shopping mall.
