

CAPSULE SUMMARY (CT - 1166):

The McGrath Barn is located on the west side of Mackall Road on a small farm known as Pinoak. Although associated with a circa 1860, the barn is of modern construction, probably dating to the second quarter of the 20th century. The 20 x 40 foot measurements are somewhat reminiscent of an earlier structure, but the materials and construction techniques are all new. The barn has recently been adapted for use as a stable.

7. DESCRIPTION (CT - 1166):

The McGrath Barn is located on the west side of Mackall Road on a terrace approximately one mile from the Patuxent River. This barn is associated with a small farm which includes a circa 1860 farm house.

The McGrath barn measures 20 x 40 feet and is oriented on a east-west axis. The barn is of modern construction, employing circular sawn timbers, wire nails and poured concrete piers. The barn has a transverse axis plan with a aisle running north-south.

The barn's 40 length is divided into five eight foot bays (one for the double doorway) and the 24 foot width is divided into two eight foot and one four foot door bay.

A corrugated metal roof is supported by common rafters on four foot centers, a flat false plate, windbraces and two collars. Tobacco was hung on circular sawn tier poles separated by 43 1/2 inch vertical distance.

The south half of the barn has recently been converted to a stable area for recreational horses with an entrance way and two stalls.

8. SIGNIFICANCE (CT-1166):

This structure is of modern construction, post-dating 1880, and probably constructed after 1940 (concrete block piers and circular sawn tier poles). The building is significant because of its association with the production of tobacco in the 20th century. The recent change in use is indicative of the overall decline of tobacco production in the third quarter of the 20th century.




