

CAPSULE SUMMARY CT - 1167

D. Parran Barn'A' is located on a private farm adjacent to the Patuxent River and Hellen Creek. The complex includes a variety of farm and domestic structures. The original 20 x 36 foot structure was probably constructed after c. 1900. The south shed appears to be original. More modern sheds are found on the east and west gable ends. An undated, unmarked, horizontal screw prize is located in the east shed. Untraditional framing techniques and modern construction materials combine to result in this unusual structure.

Parran Barn 'A' is located on a farm which extends from the mouth of Hellen Creek around to the east bank of the Patuxent River. The barn is associated with a number of other structures including a farmhouse and outbuildings, two other tobacco barns (CT 1168, 1169), a hay barn and silo.

The 20 x 36 foot barn was constructed probably after 1900. The barn is constructed of all circular sawn materials and joined with wire nails. The barn's roof is of corrugated metal sheets supported by rafters on four foot centers, two collars, no windbraces or false plate. In spite of these factors, the barn appears quite old from its exterior east facade. The barn was constructed using somewhat untraditional framing techniques, including twelve foot bays.

The south shed appears to be original and apparently intended to be open (as it is now), the barn's south wall was almost completely sided and the eave sealed with angled planks nailed to the shed king posts. The shed was sided on its east and west sides and also from about seven feet above the ground to the eave.

Somewhat later, sheds were added to the barn's east and west gable ends. These sheds employ similar framing techniques; one was apparently built primarily for curing tobacco and is served by only two small doors. No "doorway" was cut through the barn's west wall or that of the shed. The east shed, however, is served by a double door, and a doorway was cut through over the barn's sill. In addition, the barn siding was removed above the second tier pole level on that side. A horizontal screw prize is located in the east shed (no inscription, no date). This modern barn is something of an anomaly as it employs modern materials, unusual framing techniques, as well as older methods of construction.

The Parran Barn 'A' is of modern construction post-dating 1880, and probably 1900. This barn gives the appearance of being rather old from the outside, but is clearly new from the inside. Its date of construction in the early 20th century and subsequent additions are probably related to changes in agricultural practises. Additional historical research may more clearly place this barn into a specific context.


