In design, it is a typical elementary school of its period with horizontal plan, flat roof, and large window openings. These window openings have been altered.

Because only the north portion of Island Creek School is over 50 years old, only this portion of the building is described. The school is located on a large flat lot at the intersection of Broomes Island and Hance roads. A driveway extends along the east side of the building, and a parking lot is located to its north. A small area is situated to the west of the building.

The 1948-1949 block is a single story, flat-roofed building, rectangular in plan, with a two story corner tower. Fenestration has been altered in recent years. Originally, the building had single and paired, tall windows. The original window openings are defined by brick pilasters. These openings have been shortened, and the original windows replaced by fixed and transom, single light, metal-framed windows. The main entrance to this block is located in the north elevation, a metal-framed glass door. The center of interest of this block is the two story corner tower. Fenestration of this tower has also been altered with fixed and transom windows, replacing the original windows. A steel-framed stair provides access to a second story door on its north elevation. This tower is topped with a hipped, standing seam roof.

The walls of the building are sheathed in brick laid in common bond. The roof of the bulk of the building is marked by wide eaves, designed to shade the rooms from hot summer sun. A square brick furnace chimney adjoins the north wall of the building and projects well above its roof line.

The original Island Creek School, a two-room school, is believed to have been built about 1880 on Mackall Road. Long-time schoolteacher Elizabeth Gross remembered this building:

...There was a church that had built a school over there where Brooks Church is now [on Mackall Road]...back over there in the woods. It may have been Island Creek Church, but that is where the children went to school in the little building down in back of the church (as cited in Goddard 1995:35).

Ada Gantt King remembered attending the school:

...It was unpainted and appeared to be isolated. It had a well and two out-houses (one for the girls and one for the boys). It was a two-room school - one classroom for primary grades and the other for older students.

Everything was wooden, the floors, the walls, and the classrooms had desks. It was always crowded because the rooms were small, maybe 12' by 12' each.

Books were taken home nightly and my mother would buy me and my brothers pencils and notebooks from the general store. Notebooks were 5 cents and pencils were a penny. No, there were no maps in the classroom, they were in the Geography books (as cited in Goddard 1995:35).

In the 1920s, each classroom had between 35 and 40 children. The school was moved to its present Broomes Island Road site prior to 1937 (see historic map). The present school was built as a consolidated African American school. The initial portion of this school, the north end, was completed in 1948-1949. This initial portion of the building contained four classrooms. A total of 143 students were enrolled in the 1954-1955 academic year, and 182 students were enrolled during the 1956-1957 school year (Dunkle 1956:19). The south portion of the building, which contained two additional classrooms, was added in 1958-1959 (Dunkle 1956:18-19).

The school remained open until 1960 when African American schools in southern Calvert County were consolidated at Appeal Elementary School. The building is presently used as a community center and a Head Start center.

The Island Creek School is significant as a historic African American consolidated school that served the southern portion of Calvert County. The school is one of the last African American schools built in the county. In general design, it is typical of elementary schools built elsewhere at about the same time.

The school was enlarged in 1958-1959 with an addition to its south side. It is presently used as a community center.


