While the concession stand located at the waterfront on Bay Avenue in North Beach, appears to be in fair condition and to be a good example of the building type, it does not appear to be of sufficient significance to warrant National Register eligibility as an individually listed property, either under Criterion C for architecture or Criterion A for its association with the town's history as a beach resort. In addition, it is said to have been moved from its original location (just across the street). Moved buildings must possess exceptional significance to warrant listing. The integrity of the beachfront area has been considerably eroded. Thus, the snack bar can not be considered a contributing resource in an eligible district.




