This early twentieth-century four-square faces south onto Maryland Route 231. It is a two-story framed and weatherboarded house sheltered by a hipped roof with a ridgeline that runs perpendicular to the facade. A hipped dormer is set into the front face of this roof, which is covered with decoratively molded sheet metal. There are two interior brick chimneys situated near the ridgeline. The second-story facade of the house is two bays wide. The first-story facade is concealed by an enclosed hipped-roof porch.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

According to his daughter Gladys, John W. Stewart, had this house built for him c. 1920. Frank Brady was the contractor. Mr. Stewart operated the tavern next door which has been demolished and replaced with a modern building of the same function.

The house is a large three bay square with a hipped roof. A large two window dormer (6/1) protrudes from the south side (front). The first floor is covered by a full porch on the west and south sides that is supported by doric columns. Except for the 6/1 windows in the dormer, the windows are large 1/1 panes.

The six-bedroom house was heated by wood/coal stoves.




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PRINCE FREDERICK
