DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Mr. and Mrs. G. Frank Rawlings say that they have lived here for fifty-five years. They purchased the house and farm from Mrs. Rawling's father in 1943 (AWR 1/98). AAH 5/28 shows that the Buckmasters purchased the property from Mary A. Long on August 31, 1920. Long's ownership dates back to January 6, 1873 when the property passed from James N. Duke to John G. Long (SS 2/642). Certain stylistic elements suggest that the house was built quite a bit earlier than this date.

A c. 1926 photograph shows a building which is essentially Georgian in character being a tall 2 1/2 stories having a gable-end roof with pedimented dormers. An odd number of bays is divided in the middle by a hall recognizable from the outside by a central entrance that is covered with a portico. The sepia photograph also helps to document the Rawlings' recollection that the house was painted white with dark green trim.

Outbuildings:

Hurricane Hazel destroyed the oldest barn a few years ago while it still held 3000 sticks of tobacco. There is another barn on the property which Mr. Rawlings built in the 1940's. All of the other sheds and so forth appear to be relatively modern structures.




