

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Mrs. Myrtle (Howe) Taylor lives in the house which she says her father built in 1905. GWD 6/230 shows William H. Howe Jr. acquiring title to this property on March 26, 1906.

The south wing is the oldest, it is a 1 1/2 story frame building. Mrs. Taylor says that her father cut and hewed the framing timbers himself. The original siding is simple clapboards that are now covered by aluminum siding. The house consists of one room down and one above which contained a partition to divide the girls' sleeping quarters from the boys'. Mrs. Taylor's parents slept downstairs with the youngest child having a trundle bed. The house served a family of eleven. Cooking was done in a separate building which exists no longer.

The east facade faces Route 4. It is vented by a central entrance with a 6/6 window in each side. There are two smaller 6/6 windows in the upper story. There is a first floor window and a gable window on the south end. A flue chimney occupied the north end.

C. 1920 Mr. Howe doubled the size of his house with a two-story one up/one down addition on the north end. There is also a modern kitchen addition on the rear (west).

There appears to be a certain local or family tradition of builders in this immediate are, for this is not the first "self-built" house recorded. It should be noted that William H. Howe Jr's father, William H. Howe, Sr., is said to have been the builder of the log schoolhouse at St. Leonards.






SEE MAP 31 - WESTERN SHORES
