## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Two attempts failed at gaining entry or any other information about this building other than what is revealed by photographs.

A break in the simple overlap siding and a second entrance of smaller dimension in the east side suggest that a smaller cabin was enlarged. The apparent symmetry of the windows in both the east and west sides, however, does not indicate enlargement therefore suggesting the possibility of a "duplex".

This possibility is further suggested by the central flu chimney which is presumably for wood or coal stoves.

The siding and roofing, 6/6 windows and stove chimney suggest a late 19th, but most likely, are Early 20th Century building date.




NORTH BEACH QUAD.


