The main section of this two-story frame farmhouse faces south, under an east-west gable roof. A brick stove flue heats either gable end of this three-bay by one-bay house. A northern "L" section measures a rectangular one-bay-square. A brick stove flue heats its gable end. A hip-roofed screened porch fills the northeast corner of the "L".

6/6 sash light the house. Asphalt shingles cover the roof, while "German" siding sheathes the house.


