Late 19th Century

This neat and dignified cross-gable farmhouse includes finer detailing than other houses of its type. The two-story frame building's three-bay facade features a southern door comprising sidelights and a transom. All other bays on this side hold 2/2 sash windows flanked by louvered shutters. A small window lights the central cross-gable. A hip-roofed porch shelters the first floor on the facade. Tapered posts interrupt the balustrade enclosing the porch.

A two-story "L" adjoins the one-bay-deep main block to the west. A modern two-bay square room was added to the south side of the "L". German siding covers this farmhouse. A large frame tobacco barn and several sheds stand west of the dwelling.


