This three-bay by one-bay two-story frame farmhouse is distinguished from others of its type by a large brick chimney flue rising from its western gable end. This implies the inclusion of usable fireplaces rather than wood or coal stoves.

The house comprises a front, or southern, porch and a one-story frame kitchen addition to the rear. The latter is covered by a shed roof.

Although this house stands in derelict condition, it retains its original wood siding and wooden shingle roof.


