This is of a style common in Calvert County in the 1920's. Sometimes called the "foursquare" style, it appeared in other sections of the country and in urban areas from 1890 to 1930.

The two-story, hip-roofed house measures three bays across the south-facing facade. This side is covered by a hip-roofed porch with square posts. A rear two-story gable-roofed ell has a one-story porch on its east side. The square house features clipped-gable dormers facing south and east.

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DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The two-story, hip-roofed house measures three bays across the south-facing facade. This side is covered by a hip-roofed porch with square posts. A rear two-story gable-roofed ell has a one-story porch on its east side. The square house features clipped-gable dormers facing south and east.

The right-hand entrance on the facade is topped by a narrow transom. On the east side, only the right-hand bay is fenestrated. All architraves consist of plain flat boards. A brick stove-flue chimney appears at the north end of the house. Narrow lapped wooden siding covers the house.

An early 20th century gambrel-roofed barn stands north of the house.






