## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Two barns and an outbuilding survive on this farm. The main house burned early this century, and was later replaced by a three-bay, two-story frame dwelling. All three gable-roofed farm buildings feature a hewn frame sheathed in horizontal lapped weatherboards.

Barn #1, a rectangular tobacco barn is built in two sections. It retains a wood shingle roof and stands on a stone foundation.

Barn #2 is nearly square, c. 40' to a side, and stands on brick piers. Several sections have recently been repaired by the owner, with care taken to maintain the barn's original appearance. Original strap hinges accommodate lifting sections of siding for ventilation. An unusual construction feature of this barn is a massive central summer beam.




