PARRAN SCHOOL; PHILLIS A. BOWEN

This school presents a symmetrical facade to the west. Two doors topped by six-pane transoms are centered under a shed-roofed entrance porch. Five joined pairs of nine over nine sash flank either side of the entrance. The one-story frame school is covered by a gable roof.

It is similar in size to CT-507, a school in Prince Frederick. Its slightly classical styling is more refined than that of the typical county school.

This school presents a symmetrical facade to the west. Twin doors topped by six-pane transoms are centered under a shed-roofed entrance porch. Five joined pairs of nine over nine sash flank either side of the entrance. The one story frame school is covered by a gable roof.

The school stands on a concrete-covered foundation. Narrow weatherboards sheath the walls. Asphalt shingles cover the roof.


